## New Children's Home

July was a very busy month for our building project. Our Project Manager has come back to supervise the new home's progress. Volunteers from Australia installed the roof, including guttering to collect our roof water. We had previously installed large underfloor tanks to store rainwater collected during the wet season for use throughout the year. It is a relief to know rain will not slow progress any longer.

It was a real blessing to have Toby Uglow, a professional painter from Australia, donate his time to come and help us out. Toby toiled for 3 weeks, painting while also supervising a large team of volunteers from Hope Valley Uniting Church. The painting was all but completed during this time.

Hope Valley and BaliCare generously donated quality paint for the job. This saving on labour and materials was a huge help to our limited budget.

Our energetic team of volunteers also joined Rob Haggengar from Australia in manufacturing concrete blocks and constructing our septic tank. Thanks guys for completing a not-so-glamorous but essential part of our children's home.

We would like to sincerely thank Reece Plumbing Taree Australia for their generous donation of all the plumbing fittings to fit out our

4 bathrooms. The Hope Valley team were a huge help in transporting these items from Australia.

Work continued by our local tradespeople after our volunteers all returned home. We are now very close to completion of stages 1&2.

We look forward to the funds becoming available to commence stage 3 which will complete our children's new home.
